Definitions of survivorship and rehabilitation

”Survivorship”

Suosituksessa mukana sekä potilaat, joilla hoito on saatu valmiiksi että palliatiivisessa hoidossa olevat potilaat

Rehabilitation

Prosessi, joka auttaa potilaita saavuttamaan optimaalisen fyysisen, psykososiaalisen ja intellektuaalisen tason

Main messages 1-3/5

- N° 1: Cancer survivors' follow-up, late effect management and tertiary prevention needs to be anticipatory, personalised and implemented by means of care pathways, with active participation of survivors and relatives.
- N° 2: The improvement of early detection of patient's needs and the access to rehabilitation, psychosocial and palliative care services is required.
- N° 3: An integrated and multi-professional care approach with a coordination of community care providers and services are needed to implement a Survivorship Care Plan.

Main messages 4-5/5

- N° 4: For children and AYA survivors, health and psychosocial consequences of the illness and its treatments need to be anticipated and addressed.
- N° 5: Cancer research in survivorship needs to provide more data on late effects as well as the added value of supportive care, rehabilitation, palliative and psychosocial care interventions.
