Summary of activities in the past 6 months

a) 1st draft of EU recommendations

- Elaboration of the 1st draft with successive versions enriched by:
 - Experts' contributions (Barcelona WP8 meetings—June 2015)
 - WP8 partners' contributions (between Jan. & Sept 2015)
 - WP4 input on the methodology in July 2015

- Inclusion of the case study concerning inequalities in employment and an additional case study on the French patient navigator program (to be confirmed).

Summary of activities in the past 6 months

b) Elaboration of the deliverable n° 2

- Focus on the process of symptoms and psychosocial needs' assesement instead of a tool initially planned *i.e.* Distress Thermometer.
- Discussion with experts and WP8 partners on the content during the Expert group meeting in Barcelona (June 2015)
- First draft of this deliverable inserted in the section n° 2 of the recommendations related to « *Needs for a person-centred approach in psychological care, social rehabilitation, supportive and palliative care, and physical activity* ».

Working Plan for the next 6 months

1) Finalization of the draft WP8 chapter:

- Amend the draft chapter following the GCC's comments;
- Work on the missing section i.e. « Main messages », « Conclusion/summary of the recommendations »

2) Launch of the deliverable n° 3: Survivorship Care Plan (SCP)

- WP8 meeting in Trondheim - Norway (25 and 26 November 2015)
- Launch of a survey and expected results (by February 2015)

3) Highlight the work on inequalities in survivorship

- INCa will promote the work accomplished on inequalities in survivorship by publishing an article with the collaboration of Peter DUNCAN (UK expert).
