BASIC DATA

- The workpackage aims at:
 - Reviewing the current state-of-the-art of the post-oncological cancer patient care at the community/primary level in MSs
 - Mapping the experiences of this level of cancer care in some MSs – Netherlands, Bulgaria, Slovenia
 - Indicate the interfaces and relationships between health and social care for cancer patients – examples and pilot from Norway
 - Setting up a draft cancer patient pathway for post-oncological cancer patient care in the community

PLANNED ACTIVITIES 2.

- Translation of the experiences of the Norwegian Orkdal model of integration of primary health and social care for cancer patients
- Development of a draft cancer patient pathway or, at least, a structured after-care process for community-based care integrated the existing experiences of the participating countries and international experiences

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SECOND OBJECTIVE

- Member State Platform – discussion of key cancer control topics, delivering position papers to be used by Member States

SECOND OBJECTIVE 2.

- Health promoting and assistance with screening activities for skin cancer
- Development of an app and a website
- The app should be informative – self-risk assessment, guiding – monitoring of skin lesions and conducive to action – self-referral to dermatologist and/or GP
- The webpage should provide more information about the disease and the background for enhanced reading
- Target age groups should be between 18 and 35 years of age

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- European Guide on Quality Improvement in Comprehensive Cancer Control
- Enhanced co-operation between the Member States on cancer policy and cancer care issues
- New approaches to integration of care at the regional level
- Added focus to primary and community care of cancer patients
- Survivorship placed firmly as one of the key aspects of overall cancer management
- Guidance through the challenges and novelties in cancer screening
